All Users

Dogs

- Dogs must be under control at all times
- Unleashed dogs can cause:
 - spooked horses which are dangerous for the dog, rider and other trail users,
 - dangerous encounters with other dogs and wildlife (e.g., porcupines, bears),
 - disturbance to wildlife.
 - increased dog waste on trails

Cyclists

- Please call out as early as possible to notify other users of your presence.
- When meeting horseback riders, please stop immediately and ask the rider how to proceed. A spooked horse can be dangerous. Talk to the horse and rider in a calm voice and remove sunglasses and helmet to let the horse know you are a person.

Horseback Riders

- Please clean up after your horse in parking lot, trailhead areas and along trail.
- Please do not use the Green trail section along Hogsback Hill. Follow bypass signage.






